



HISTORY

Curley Park Rangers was established in 1973 when a team of Under 11s entered into the Farnborough & District League (now North East Hants Youth League). The club was a Lightwater club and the name chosen was Curley Park Rangers so named by Mrs Hazel Lucas ,a teacher at Connaught School, and wife of Maurice Lucas who was the manager of our first team. The name Curley was taken from Curley Hill which is the highest point in Lightwater Country Park. There was already a Lightwater Youth team at the under 16 level, but for some reason they did not want to run an under 11 team. Undeterred by this disappointment Maurice, together with other parents, decided to form their own club hence Curley Park Rangers was born. An advertisement for players at Under 11 level was placed in the local press and the response was very positive. Finance, as always, was a problem. However, the Club was greatly assisted by a donation of £90 (a lot of money back then) from a resident of Lightwater. Molly Light was the organiser of a local ladies club which folded leaving £90 in their kitty without a good home so she decided to donate to Curley Park Rangers.

..Originally the Club was a Lightwater club and had 'Lightwater' inserted in the club badge. As the name of the club spread boys joined from Bagshot and Windlesham so we became a Parish club to include all 3 villages and 'Lightwater' was dropped from the club's badge. Now we accept players, both boys and girls, from anywhere in the locality. The word 'Boys' also appeared in our registered name but this too was dropped when we started a girls team. The current badge was designed by Gary Foster. The designer of the original badge is unknown but it was over 40 years ago!

It should be remembered that boy's football was nowhere near the organised structure it is now. There was practically no organised football for boys in the local area. A number of parents volunteered their help and it was decided that Maurice would be the manager. A committee was formed which was Maurice Chairman, Ron Dyer assistant manager, plus John and Audrey Passfield. Audrey became Secretary and Treasurer was a Mr. Panazia The colours chosen were amber and black because Maurice went to see Barnet F.C. play and these were the colours worn by them which Maurice liked and these were the colours registered with the League An original amber and black hooped shirt can be seen in the club house.

As each season passed a new Under 11s was formed until 1980 when we had all age groups represented up to Under 16s. The 2 older groups 17s and 18s came along much later as did the Junior Club.

JUNIOR CLUB

As parents turned up with even younger children it was decided in 1985 to form a junior club a task that was undertaken by Max Thomas and Keith Ross. We were in advance of the F.A. before they introduced small sided matches played on small pitches for teams under the age of 11. Our junior club incorporates the 'Nippers Club' which is for boys and girls under the age of 6 but having achieved their 5th birthday. We do not accept players under 5 because they cannot be insured.

GIRLS FOOTBALL

In days of yore girls did not play football but now they do. We always had the odd one or two girls playing but they gave up quite early. Now they don't. The problem has always been that at least 14 girls are required to form a team. We have occasionally succeeded. In 1902/03 we had a team of Under 12s who played in the Surrey County Women's and Girls Football League. There was also a team of U15s who in 2006/7 season won the Hampshire County Cup and were runners up the following year. In order to accommodate girls football the word 'boys' was dropped from our name. We are no longer 'Curley Park Rangers (Boys) F.C. Lightwater' .We are plain Curley Park Rangers F.C.

PRESENTATION NIGHTS.

In the mid 70s presentation nights were held at Lightwater Infants school. As we got bigger we moved to Lightwater Country Park and then on to Connaught Middle School. Once our membership exceeded 500 there was not a large enough facility within the parish so now all teams make their own arrangements.

We always tried to have a celebrity to give out the awards and have had Tommy Langley (Chelsea and QPR), Steve Clarke (Scotland and Chelsea) Ken Moncou (Chelsea and Southampton), Dave Clement (England and QPR)

SOCCERFEST

Soccerfest was originally launched as "Skills Day" on the early May bank holiday Monday 1993. It was designed as a fund raising activity based on sponsored skills. It ran for about 2 years after which we introduced small sided football games at each age level and then renamed it Soccerfest. It has been a very popular event ever since.

VISITS AND TOURS

We have been privileged to entertain a number of visiting foreign clubs. Team N'Eastern from Garden City, New York have been here on 2 occasions. We were also visited by Dynamo FC from the Mustang League, California USA..

One of our dads, Marco Tirraro, got talking to a stranger in an Amsterdam café. The stranger turned out to be a Bob Degenars who was involved with a Dutch youth football club named VVA. From that chance meeting came an exchange arrangement which lasted several years

VVA Amsterdam became regular visitors during the 80s, along with Buitenveldert, also from Holland. On our part we visited Holland in 1981, 1983, 1985, 1991 and 1993. It was on a visit to Holland that we won the D.Jun D.Hamersma Toernooi Under 11 Cup which you can see in the clubhouse.

PITCHES

As the size of the club increased it brought about the problem of pitches

Thanks to the Windlesham Parish Council our first ground was the Recreational Field behind All Saints Church, Lightwater. As the need for pitches increased we obtained permission from the M.O.D to use an army pitch at Deepcut. This pitch we used for many years, indeed, up until the time the M.O.D. decided to build houses on it. The biggest step forward was when we obtained permission to use Connaught School field which is the biggest field in the parish. Other pitches we have used are St Lawrence school field at Chobham, Bagshot F.C. ground at College Ride, Briars Road, Lightwater and Lightwater Country Park. Since we now considered we are a Windlesham Parish club (indeed, our rules at the time restricted membership to the 3 villages) we applied to play

at Windlesahm Field since a third of our membership came from Windlesham. However, our application was refused. With club membership in 2013 standing at 500 we currently use Connaught, Briars Road, Recreational Field, Lightwater and Lightwater Country Park, Kings School and Collingwood both in Camberley

FINANCE

As previously stated we started with a donation from a Molly Light. The subscription then (1973) was £4 for league players and £2 for non-league players. We have travelled a long way since then. In the early days our biggest 'earner' was the legendry monthly Junior Discos which we held at All Saints Church Hall. The hall was always packed out with youngsters queueing to get in. We also held Adult Discos. These were held about twice a year and like the junior discos were very popular. Sadly these things only have a certain shelf life but they lasted for many years. Other sources of income is the canteen at Connaught run by manager Sharron Simpkins. The sale of football kit handled by Ken Johnson at Soccerfest. There was also the 100 Club. Of course, the major financial contribution comes from sponsorship. At one time our football kit had to last for years and each team inherited the kit each season from the team above. It was the old mothers maxim 'don't worry he will grow into it!'

We also received a substantial grant from the Football Association for the installation of the floodlights at Connaught school. Lastly, and most importantly, we receive an annual grant from Windlesham Parish Council. This is for the upkeep of Connaught field. Under the heading of Finance must come sponsorship. Fortunately we have had the benefit of sponsorship from many companies both large and small. Indeed there are so many that there is not room to mention them all. We are grateful to all those companies that have sponsored various teams though out the decades. The Football Association have also got their sponsors the main one as far as junior clubs are concerned are Macdonalds who have supported Grass Roots football ; They have benefited the club in recent times.
